There has been such an amazing spirit of perseverance and flexibility from our international Project Teams as they've adapted to new procedures and protocols with many, many covid tests along the way.

Today, we're pleased to see that our Health Centers have overcome the early challenges of lockdowns and are again thriving. Not only are they seeing more patients, they're now expanding their health care services!

In Peru, our Health Center has broadened their reach from optical, dental and physical therapy to now include ophthalmology services. And in Ecuador, the Health Center is planning to grow from providing ophthalmology services to offering general surgery!

All of which is developing under the oversight of the Board of Directors and our dedicated office team who support all aspects of Medical Ministry International's field programs.

During this time, our international leaders have been serving such a critical role. First, they respond to invitations from local communities, conduct assessments of local needs and develop relationships with local health care professionals, churches and community leaders. Then, they design programs that are able to meet these unique health care needs before organizing one and two week Project Teams with the goal of establishing long-term Health Care Centers.

All of this makes such a difference for people awaiting life-saving care around the world. However, it's only possible with support from generous donors like you. Together, we're making lasting change a reality for so many people and we're so grateful for your support.

HOW PAYING IT FORWARD TURNED DONNA & FABIOLA INTO LIFELONG FRIENDS

Your support brings help where it's needed most, but it also brings people together. For Donna and Fabiola, that meant a unique and fulfilling friendship!

I've been so fortunate to receive medical training, so when I retired as a registered nurse I wanted to use my skills to pay it forward. Each year for 12 years, I raise \$3000 - \$7000 to purchase medication for a Project trip to the Dominican Republic.

One afternoon, I was working in the pharmacy when I saw a woman looking nervous outside our clinic. She had come for a consultation but was very anxious. We didn't speak the same language, so she rubbed her fingers together to let me know she had no money to pay. I gave her the goahead and she ran to our entrance.

Her name was Fabiola. She was a poor, widowed Haitian, diagnosed as HIV positive. She came to us looking for retro virals—but we could supply her with a year's worth of iron and vitamin B to keep her healthy, plus antibiotics to ward off infection.

I immediately connected with Fabiola and started bringing her care packages each

time I visited—always with a year's supply of vitamins and antibiotics! When I stepped off the bus in Nagua, Fabiola was there waiting with the biggest hug. As the years passed, she started bringing me gifts like oranges, avocados, even ice cream!

During one of the hurricanes, her leaky tin house was levelled by a huge avocado tree, leaving her destitute. I did all I could to help. Though it took 5 years to build, last January she showed me her new block home, beaming from ear to ear.




